Traffic and parking is obviously an issue each morning and evening for drop off and collection. There are 136 children on roll this year, our highest ever number, and the pre and after school facility continues to go from strength to strength in the hall. There obviously isn't a car space for every parent outside the school. We are restarting our Park 'N Stride initiative to encourage more children to walk some of the way to school (parents can park at the church, fairgreen or other places on the outskirts of the village). We are also asking parents to continue to respect the disabled parking space outside the hall and also the 'Drop and Go' space outside the old school gate (primarily used by the school bus).

Accelerated Reader

AR targets have been set for all children from 1st to 6th classes. AR is designed to establish a culture of reading in children through giving them autonomy over what they choose to read. It also allows us to monitor children's progress and provide feedback where required. When children are taking guizzes on books they have read, they must log into the correct Renaissance Login page for our school (there are many identical pages for other schools and a web search will not locate the correct one). The easiest way to find the correct page is under the 'Parents Section' of the school website under the 'Useful Information' tab. Please note that not every book published is on the AR system but all our class libraries only have books on the AR system. Use the website www.arbookfinder.com to determine whether a book is on AR or not.

Munster Minor Schools Swimming

The Munster Minor School's Swimming Championship will take place on Sunday 15th of October in UL Arena. There are U9, U10, U11 and U12 competitions and Swimmers will be able to enter 2 individual events from 50m Freestyle; 50m Backstroke; 50m Breaststroke; 50m Butterfly; and 100m Individual Medley. There will also be $200m (4 \times 50m)$ relay races - medley and freestyle - for girls and for boys. Cross Country

Children in all classes are currently completing the Athletics Strand in PE. This is to prepare the children from 1st-6th class for the upcoming Cross Country competition which will be held in Lee's Road in early October. We will be holding trials this week to make up our girls and boys U10, U12 and O12 teams. Running Club takes place every Tuesday from 3-4pm for ALL children from 1st-6th class. Emphasis is on running technique along with building speed and endurance.

Student Teaching Practice

Our school facilitates student teachers from training college on placement each year. Róisín Giblin starts her extended placement with us this week. Róisín will teach in Senior Infants from 2nd-20th October and in 4th Class from 6th-24th November. We also have a large number of former students completing their transition year work experience and are looking forward to welcoming them all.

> Absences-Please note that we are required to report children with 20 days or more absences in a school year to the Child and Family Agency, Túsla. If your child has been absent from school, an email or written note is required as these notes are used in our returns when explaining absences. (There is no need to

ring the school to explain a child's absence as verbal explanations cannot be accepted when making our returns).

Contacting the School-Please note that our secretary, Robina Jones, works on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays from 10am to school end. Outside of these times the school phone is not answered as all staff are in class or on the yard. Email is usually the quickest and best way to make contact with the school both during and outside school opening times.
